Masonic Symbolism — The Hourglass



According to our North Carolina Lodge Manual, the hourglass "is an emblem of human life" and then waxes poetically about how rapidly our lives draw to a close as shown by how quickly the sand has fallen to the bottom of the hourglass. But are there any deeper meanings to this symbol?

One article [1] suggests that the hourglass can have a variety of meanings. Since the hourglass is an instrument used to measure time, this article suggests it can mean that "we are all moving forward in time and are unable to reverse the sands up the glass" and since "the sand con-



tinues to migrate from the top of the glass to the bottom of the glass, regardless of our station or position in life or how much wealth we may amass", it can also represent that we are all equal or on the level. The author of this article also suggests that death is another allusion represented by hourglass, which is similar to what our lodge manual infers.

An article from the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction of the Scottish Rite suggests that "the need to flip the hourglass signifies the cycle between life and death" and that "it could also be said that the need to flip the hourglass demonstrates a man's need to, at times, change his thoughts and actions to progress on his journey" rather than being stuck on one side. This article also indicates that the hourglass also reminds us of the eternity of the soul since "one day, we will be able to turn the hourglass on its side, halt the flow of its sands, and be recognized by our Creator for our good works here".

In many ways, the hourglass is yet another reminder to live a full life, make the most of our time, and cherish the tenets of our Brotherhood.

Famous Freemason — John Theophilus Desaguliers

Desaguliers, John Theophilus (1683-1744) – John Desaguliers was a French Freemason and natural philosopher. On 29 July 1714, he was elected a member of The Royal Society of London, and progressed to be presented with the Royal Society's highest honour, the Copley Medal, in 1734, 1736 and 1741, with the 1741 award being for his discovery of the properties of electricity. He studied at Oxford, became experimental assistant to Freemason Sir Isaac Newton. An ardent Freemason, Desaguliers was elected the third Grand Master in 1719, and was Deputy Grand Master in 1723 and 1725 of the newly formed



Premier Grand Lodge of England. In which capacity he oversaw the publication of the first Masonic Book of Constitutions in the world. It was said of Desaguliers, "Of all those who were engaged in the revival of Freemasonry in the beginning of the Eighteenth Century, none performed a more important part than he to whom may be well applied the epithet of 'The Father of Modern speculative Freemasonry', and to whom, perhaps, more than any other person, is the present Grand Lodge of England indebted for its existence."
